

# MEN'S SUITS & SPORTCOATS: FIND YOUR FIT & HOW TO MEASURE

### FIT

Suits and sportcoats are designed with varying fits through the chest, sides and waist. Use our guide to determine which fit is right for you.



## HOW TO MEASURE

Suit and sportcoat sizes have one number and one descriptive word (for example, 38 short, 40 regular, 42 long). The number refers to your chest measurement, and the descriptive word refers to the length of the jacket.

Check your own measurements and look for additional size information on the product page to determine which size you should purchase.

Need help? Find the store nearest you and come in for an expert fitting.

# Over Arm With arms at your sides, have someone measure around the broadest part of your shoulders and upper arms. Chest With arms at your sides, measure around your upper body, under your armpits and over the fullest part of your chest and shoulder blades.

## Waist

Bend to one side to find the natural crease of your waist. Measure at this point, keeping the tape comfortably loose around your waist.

## Inseam

Measure similarly styled pants that fit you well. Measure from the crotch seam to the hem.

Suit Length	Height					
X-Short (XS)	5'3 1/2" and under					
Short (S)	5'4" to 5'7"					
Regular (R)	5'7 1/2" to 5'11"					
Long (L)	5'11 1/2" to 6'2 1/2"					
X-Long (XL)	6'3" and up					

Tall suits are classified as X-Long (6'3" and up). Big suits are classified as 48 U.S. chest size and up.

## Helpful Hints

- If your over-arm measurement is more than 7" larger than your chest measurement, choose a suit one size larger than your chest.
- Suits have what is called a "drop," which is the difference between the size of the jacket and the size
  of the pants. Classic-fit suits typically have a 6" drop, meaning that a size 38R jacket is paired with
  size 32 pants. Trim-fit suits typically have a 7" drop.
- Suit makers usually leave enough extra fabric at the seams to allow pants to be let out by I" to 2".
   Pants can always be taken in.
